The Responsibility of a Catholic Citizen in a Free Society

Catholics have many responsibilities in our modern day free society. A twelve year old boy has normal responsibilities such as schoolwork but Catholic citizens have other responsibilities such as praying every day, being a steward, and respecting life and others. As a Catholic we have to remember that we are made in God's image and should try to live like Jesus Christ. If we do these things we are living as responsible Catholics.

Catholics have the responsibility of praying every day in our free society. Throughout the Bible Jesus teaches us to pray to God. Our prayers help us communicate with God and strengthen our faith in him. Without prayer, we can't thank God or request help from him. Through prayer we also grow stronger in our relationship with God. Praying is an important part of practicing the Catholic faith.

Stewardship is a vital part of being Catholic. In the Bible, we are told that God made each of us to be stewards of his creation. This means that we need to take care of ourselves, others, and all living things. When we take care of these things, it is a way of saying thank you to God for all he has given us and it is respectful to God. In the Bible, Peter tells us that we must "Be hospitable to one another without complaining. As each one has received a gift, use it to serve one another as good stewards of God's varied grace. Whoever preaches, let it be with the words of God; whoever serves, let it be with the strength that God supplies, so that in all things God may be glorified through Jesus Christ, to whom belong glory and dominion forever and ever. Amen." 1 Peter 4:9-11. Stewardship recognizes God as the creator and father of all. We must also share what he has individually given us with others. This means our time and our talents should be used not just for us, but also for others. When we do this, we serve God and everyone around us.

Catholics respect human life. All humans have a right to life and to live in a decent way. Catholics have a responsibility to protect these rights. Catholics must protect unborn babies, the elderly, the sick and anyone who needs help in keeping the right to life and decency. This can be very hard as those that need help the most may not be able to ask for help but we must see on our own that they need our help. Providing the help needed may not be easy or popular. It may mean that we need to speak for those who can't (the unborn babies or the really sick) or sometimes spending time to help others rather hanging out with our friends. We must respect others and remember that all life is sacred and we must take care of it just like we take care of ourselves.

In a free society, Catholics have responsibilities such as praying every day, being a steward, and respecting life and others. By exercising these responsibilities, we bring ourselves closer to God and honor Him by caring for all His creations, including those that can't care for themselves. We are stewards of God's creations and are called to love and care for one another.
