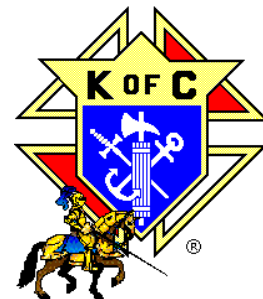

FROM THE GRAND KNIGHT:

Well it's getting to be that time again, the DD Tootsie Roll Drive is right around the corner. We face some new challenges this year. Creve Coeur is no longer allowing soliciting on the islands at intersections. This will take us off the corners at Fee Fee and

Olive and Mason and Olive. The Good news is we've added a couple extra store fronts to solicit. We'll need to fill all of the 140+ time slots to meet our \$15,000 goal this year. As a side note with any luck we'll have a speaker from Cardinal Glennon at the September council meeting.

NOVEMBER KNIGHTS:

In early November our council will stage two TEST events. Both are new events. The first, a **KofC/Dierbergs BBQ Joint Venture** (weekend of **November 1st & 2nd**). The second is a single **Friday Night Food Episode** "drive-thru only" event on **November 7th**).

As you may know, work is underway to prepare a strategic business plan for the council. The plan proposes a 3 to 4 year phase-in period. A critical part of the plan calls for the elimination the BBQ at Four Seasons Shopping Center. So it is important to develop a plan to create new opportunities for increased council revenue.

The KofC/Dierbergs BBQ event is intended to replace not only the Four Season BBQ but also its companion Lest We Forget event - which is our only major patriotic function. The net proceeds from this joint venture event will be donated to the same charitable organization we supported last year - This Able Veteran (TAV). This is the organization which trains service dogs to support veterans experiencing Traumatic Brain Injury (TBI) and Post Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD).

Essentially, Dierbergs will perform the majority of the work by smoking, preparing and serving the BBQ food. The basic job of the IW Knights, along with possible partner councils, is promotional. The Knight's job is to advertise via bulletins, social media outlets and word-of-mouth. The Knights will receive a charitable donation of \$1.00 per pound on meat products which we will in-turn donate to TAV. Dierbergs will accept orders in person, via their web site and our newly redesigned mobile web site.

We will provide all our members the web address of the mobile web site along with a promotional piece about the patriotic charitable cause we are supporting. We would ask that you forward the information to a plethora of your local contacts. And, here are two important facts:

- 1) The 2-day event is being planned around popular football games in order to promote the idea of suggesting to our patriotic charitable customers to plan their own event around:
 - a. Nov 1st Vanderbilt at Mizzou game
 - b. Nov 2nd Rams at San Francisco game
- 2) We will ask two neighboring councils to join us - Ascension and Cardinal Ritter (i.e. St Monica, St. Richard and possibly St John Bosco). If they join us, Dierbergs will offer the event through four stores along Olive/Clarkson corridor (i.e. Craig Rd., Mason Rd., Four Seasons and Baxter Rd.)

The reason we refer to the event as a **TEST** is because Dierbergs is willing to extend the event through at least 10 stores in St. Louis and St. Charles counties. With this coverage we can ask 25 or 30 councils to join us. So, with the looming potential for such a large event we feel the concept should be tested before we go with a full roll-out.

On the other-hand, we have also labeled the November 7th **Friday Night Food Episode** as a **TEST** for these different reasons:

- 1) This event is an exploratory, logistical test-run for the launch of "Drive-Thru Lane" to be added to our Lenten Fish Fry starting next February
- 2) We will introduce several menu items which might be popular next year should we launch the proposed **4th Friday Summer Series** of (3) outside food events.

We recognize that November 7th seems late in the Fall, but here are three thoughts we considered as we planned an early November outside event when it became evident that Nov. 7th was the earliest Fall date available:

- 1) The strategy is Drive-Thru ONLY (however, during the Summer Series events we may consider providing an outside seating option)
- 2) We will offer primarily a sandwich/taco driven menu (e.g. Cajun cod, Pulled pork, Louisiana Shrimp Po-boy, a tilapia or cod fish taco and smoked BBQ Ribs with sides of slaw, CW baked beans and chips). One new factor, which we previously did not include, will be the addition of better quality sandwich bread.

- 3) If we intend to experiment with a "Drive-Thru" lane for the Lenten Fish Fry and Summer Series - November 7th is our latest and thus only practical chance to experiment with the configuration and logistical issues before the start of the 2015 Fish Fry. Ash Wednesday is February 18th, so our first fish fry is Friday February 13th.

Finally, our promotional pitch to the IW parishioners will be: Please **HELP US test** two newly created events - the KofC/Dierbergs BBQ JV and the Fall Outside Food event. Consider this idea: Plan a Fall football and food event for one or both of the two November weekends.

Doing so accomplishes several things:

- 1) You can host a fun event for friends and family
- 2) Watch the local teams compete and,
- 3) support our wounded military veterans.

FROM THE FAMILY DIRECTOR:

Dear fellow Knights of Columbus 9981 members,

I am writing you today regarding the Wednesday Night Adoration / Benediction at Incarnate Word Church. As long as I have been attending the weekly benediction at IW, attendance has been very low, with the exception of the Life Teen night on the first Wednesday. The most people I have seen at the Wednesday Night Adoration / Benediction is five (5) and often times only one or two others attend, in addition to Deacon Stallings and me.

Doesn't our Lord in the form of the Blessed Sacrament deserve better than this? For as I wrote in a Big B Files commentary on Monday, July 23, 2012.....

"Let me begin this Big B File by addressing those of you who think that all Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament, also known as Eucharistic Adoration, is just sitting in a church for an hour doing absolutely nothing by asking you all this question . . . When you are at Mass and you go up for communion, what is that you receive . . . just a piece of bread or what? Let me repeat that . . . When you are at Mass and you go up for communion, what is that you receive . . . just a piece of bread or what? The answer is that it is much more than that. As Jesus Christ himself said at the Last Supper and as the priest says in the consecration at Mass, he says the following: "Take this all of you and eat of it, for this is my body, which will be given up for you." Let me repeat that . . . "Take this all of you and eat of it, for this is my body, which will be given up for you." The high priest himself, Jesus Christ, said those very words at the Last Supper, which was the first Eucharist. The Eucharist is Jesus himself. Wherever the Eucharist is present, that Jesus is himself present."
