2016 FISH FRY UPDATES:

The 2016 Fish Fry season comes to life early on a Friday evening - February 5th.

Although the weather, outside, could be frightful; the Cod, inside, will be delightful! Let it snow, Let it Snow, Let it SNOW!

The following outline itemizes the key Fish Fry elements, dates, new and discontinued procedures.

- 1) The seven consecutive Friday dates on which we will stage the Frys will be: 2/5, 2/12, 2/19, 2/26, 3/4, 3/11, 3/18.
- 2) Each Fish Fry begins at 4PM and ends at 7PM we request the setup crew to arrive by 2PM each Friday and the cleanup crew to report at 6:45PM, if possible.
- 3) To date, we hope to maintain the same menu and pricing however, it is possible the final menu may include several modest changes.
- 4) The shrimp and vegetable boil will likely operate during only 3 or 4 Fries, including first one. The other Cajun items, introduced last season, will be served at each Fry.
- 5) Four (4) new Cajun items will be introduced this season but marketed as "Cajun Special Menu Items". Here is how we intend to handle the introduction of the items:
 - (a) The new Cajun items are: Shrimp Etoufee, Shrimp Jambalaya, Cod Creole (all based on red sauce recipes) and Shrimp Fettuccini in white sauce
 - (b) These items will be introduced separately on a weekly basis and served on a rotating basis throughout the season
 - (c) The Menu/Order Form will itemize a line stating "Special Menu Item" along with a price (all items will be priced the same) but will not publish specific item names
 - (d) We have purchased a 36" multi colored, LED lighted Message Board which will hang in the tunnel and list the names and prices of the off-menu Cajun Special(s) along with any other specials or promotions of the evening
- 6) This season we introduce a new Mardi Gras event to be staged ONLY on "Fat Friday" (the non-Lenten, initial Fry date). This "Fat Friday Mardi Gras event" will begin at 7PM with dinner served by the Knights at 7:30 in the IW Kent Center. Although it will be an IW Knight's event, there are a number of grade school/PSR moms promoting the pre-sale of tickets and organizing the event. We hope this event develops into an annual affair. Tickets will cost \$20 a person and include dinner, beads/mask and two tickets for wine or Cajun beer (the sale of limited quantities of alcohol was approved by Father Vowels). You will be sent a copy of the event brochure as soon as it is completed. Tickets will be sold through the Parish Office and on-line at EventBrite.com.

NOTE: We intend to serve samples of each of the New Cajun items at both the January General Meeting and the Council Social later in January.

7) We intend to continue building our "Outside Venue or (OV)" in order to accept "Take-Out" and "On-Line" orders, payment and service in an outside area removed from our inside LCH operations. We have permission to construct our three white "BBQ" tents before Fat Friday, deploy them weekly in the same spot where we operate our parish picnic concession and then secure & store them on the vacant ground north of the fenced playground area. Since the tents

- will remain "constructed" throughout the entire Fish Fry season we will need to move them back and forth (about 100' trip) on Friday evening and before the 5PM Mass on Saturday evening. This will require a crew of six people before and at some point after each Fry.
- 8) The Council approved a budget to purchase certain assets to facilitate the Outside Venue operation. The four types of assets are: a) pop-up tents (although we are going to experiment first with the tents we own), b) propane heater(s) in order to keep the workers and customers comfortable, c) rolling bread/supply racks (to help move fish and other provisions from the kitchen to the Outside Venue, d) food-warmer to be stationed in the OV during our Fry.
- 9) In order to minimize the confusion of orders being prepared for three different types of customers we intend to use three separate colored *Menu & Order Forms*. The text on each color
 - menu will be exactly the same with the usual <u>White paper</u> for the Inside LCH Eat-In service, <u>Blue paper</u> for OV Take-Out service and <u>Yellow paper</u> for OV On-Line service.
- 10) Weather permitting, **Blue service** will likely begin with the 2nd Fry on 2/12. **Yellow service** will likely begin with the 3rd Fry on 2/19.
- 11) We will continue to accept product payments by: cash, checks and credit cards via on-line use of the Square. *White service* will pay only at the LCH cashier table and collect their food from the Service Line 1 & 2. *Blue and Yellow service* will pay and collect food at the OV venue (i.e.
 - Service Line 3). We expect to have new Square equipment which will process payments made with credit cards containing the new security chips.
