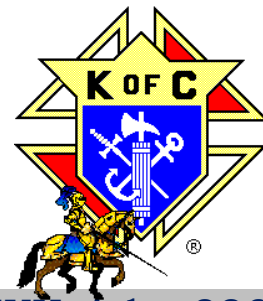

UPDATE on the 2016 FISH FRY and Mardi Gras Results

The preliminary results of the 2016 Fish Fry appear to be strong again this season. All of the expenses may not be logged as of yet but the numbers we are presenting below are very close to the final results.

Revenues:	\$53,526 (includes Mardi Gras revenue - \$3,980)
LESS: Operating Expenses:	\$37,322
LESS: Capital Expenditures:	\$ 2,048 (Purchase of warmer and two rolling tray racks)
ADD: estimated FMV (2) of food purchased, prepared and donated to Missionaries of Charities	\$ 3,600
NET INCOME	<u>\$17,756</u>

The following are notes to this year's financial operations along with some comments and suggestions regarding this year's event and planning for the 2017 event.

- 1)** The line item described as Fair Market Value (**FMV**) ... is a non-revenue number which is an estimate of the total value of the food we purchased and prepared (over the seven (7) weeks of the season) but was unsold at end of each Fry (including the Mardi Gras event). Each Friday evening much of the unsold food was packed in containers, refrigerated overnight then delivered as a donation to the Missionaries of Charities (i.e. Blessed Teresa's order located in North City) for use in their Soup Kitchen. The food delivered was primarily: fried cod, shrimp (fried and boiled), tilapia, jambalaya, seafood gumbo, along with significant amounts of our various side orders. The amount is conservative and could easily amount to 10% or more of our total Revenues.
- 2)** The revenue from the Mardi Gras/Fat Friday event is a combination of ticket sales (190 @ \$20.00 each) and donations (i.e. IWKnights, parishioners and vendors). I estimate the event broke even financially. It was an estimate because of the difficulty in determining the allocation of food costs between the Fish Fry and Mardi Gras event. The event's major expenses were: the band, food and decorations (however, items valued at \$500 are likely reusable during future events).
- 3)** For a number of reasons the Mardi Gras/Fat Friday event was judged a significant success and was very well-received by the parish. There has been quite bit of conversation about whether we should discontinue the first Fish Fry and concentrate only on an annual Mardi Gras event on Fat Friday (i.e. the Friday before Ash Wednesday). If we chose to stage only the Mardi Gras event - it could take one of several forms. So there will likely be many conversations throughout the rest of the year before we agree on the exact format.
- 4)** There were a number of new or recently introduced strategies/areas which need to be pointed to since they have contributed the growing success of our event.

a) Cajun Fish Fry brand and menu items - since we introduced the Cajun theme last season - excluding the two beginning pre-Lent fries (2015 = \$2,850 & 2016 = \$2,300) the total nightly revenues for the 12 Lenten Fries were less than \$7,000 only once (\$6,600), we collected revenues in the \$7,000's 5 times (3 of which exceeded \$7,500) and in the \$8,000's on 6 occasions. In a later issue we will provide a list of sales by menu item.

b) The Outdoor effort (Take-out and On-line sales) - this subject is best addressed at length in a later newsletter when next year's Outdoor plan is determined. We did have some logistical problems with the Outdoor and On-line effort but the effort is valuable for several reasons: (1) many of the usual customers liked not needing to stand in the Tunnel and/or LCH line inside; (2) we were consistently selling over \$1,000 per night, (3) average sales per ticket exceeded inside by \$3 to \$5 per customer; (4) the Outdoor effort resulted in shorter lines inside and the crowd inside was smaller even though our nightly total revenues essentially stayed up over \$7,500. Outdoors is our potential growth area along with better use of our On-line capabilities.

c) Manpower and collaboration with non-Knights - manpower (or the lack of it) is traditionally a major hurdle. In order to increase our efficiency outdoors we will need more participation from the council or a number of new, energetic Knights or more collaboration with outside ministries or individuals. Especially helpful this season were the ladies who helped take orders (freeing-up

Knights to work in other areas), Lisa's work with the Gumbo and Jambalaya, Marti Wennemann's help with the Cajun items and Steve and Pat with the Shrimp Boil.

d) Kitchen overcrowding or production capacity - with increased sales comes increased stress on the kitchen crew due to the need to produce more fish, shrimp, tilapia, fries and hush puppies plus sides. In a way, we are a victim of our own success. The better we are - especially the consistent quality of our food - the more the pressure will build in the kitchen. A feasible solution is to move the fry production outdoors - for the Outside sales ONLY - of the fish, shrimp, fries and hush puppies. It is possible to purchase portable propane-fueled fryers. Of course, we need more discussion and planning before making such a move. More on this idea later.

e) Menu price increases - no one seems certain as to when was the last increase in our menu prices. It may have been 5 or more years! Anyway, incremental cost increases - over those years - have eroded our profits. At the last planning meeting the idea of raising many of the menu items by \$1.00 seemed to meet with approval. Of course, that would take most of our Dinners to \$9.00 and the Plates to \$6.00. Decisions on new prices for the Bulk and Cajun items have not yet been discussed.
