### **FROM THE GRAND KNIGHT:**

Brother Knights,

The month of January started 2012 off with numerous opportunities to serve the Knights, the Parish, and the community. From meetings to a blood drive, 3<sup>rd</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> Sunday activities, from the free throw contest to essay and poster judging, non-stop baby bottle brigade activities, the effort to re-energize the Knights of our Council, and all the behind the scenes planning for activities on the horizon. One of my most memorable was attending the "Life Really Matters" event. It is easy to get discouraged

about some of the youth today. I see a lack of respect for their elders, for dress code, for manners and ethics, and a lack of belief in anything other than whatever they feel like at that moment. It was sad to watch the Occupy Movement and think those are our future leaders. I am sure we all thought our parents knew nothing only to find that they were a lot smarter than we gave them credit for but today's youth has taken that to a new level. What touched my heart about the "Life Really Matters" event was not just the reason that these 1100+ teenagers were gathering but their joy, their respect for their elders and one another. They had an understanding and focus on the meaning of the Pro-Life cause and the March in Washington DC. They also did a great job with the money they collected, almost \$8000. They understand that we must stand up for those who cannot stand up for themselves. There is hope for the next generation. I would guess that a large majority (if not all) of us would consider ourselves pro-life. When it comes to

this 'issue' we are decided: we oppose abortion, we oppose the killing of the elderly or the diseased, and we oppose death in favor of life. Of course, I believe that this is indeed the right stance (the biblical stance) on these issues.

Yet, I would also argue that there are different ways that a person can be pro-life. For some, this is just another political issue that impacts who they vote for or who they vote against. For others, this is far more significant than a political issue. They pray and fight and work and do all they can to support life and oppose the culture of death. I would dare say that most of us are somewhere in the middle of these two approaches. My goal is to challenge each of us to consider just how pro-life we are. I read an article looking at four biblical principles that call us to be pro-life.

- First, we are to be fruitful and multiply.
- Second, we are to view children as a blessing.
- Third, we are to protect the needy.



- Fourth, we are to care for widows and orphans.

Each principle has examples throughout the bible and provides opportunities to practice in our lives today. There is a difference between being conveniently committed to the pro-life cause and being radically committed to the principles noted. As Knights, what issue would take precedence over life? Is voting and prayer enough? Is prayer enough or does God want us to act upon our prayers? Are we like Gideon, hoping and longing for the Lord to act, while the Lord responds: do not I send you (Judges 6:14)? There is nothing wrong with praying until it becomes our excuse not to do what the Lord calls us to do.

February is the start of a busy month with the Valentine's Brunch, the fish fry's, the Bishop's Blast, and planning for many other activities. Arch Bishop Carlson's letter is attached to the Newsletter for everyone to read. I am hoping that you can give of yourself and be part of the T.E.A.M. because (Together Everyone Achieves More).

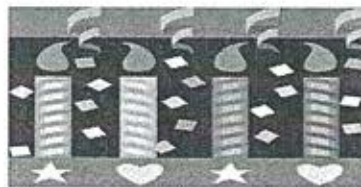

## **PRO-LIFE:**

Teenagers from Ascension parish delivered Roses for Life from both Ascension and Incarnate Word parish to Senators Blunt and McCaskill on Monday, January 23, 2012. Council 9981 collected 348 roses and also \$409 for the Archdiocesan Coalition for Life. A majority of the roses were delivered to Senator McCaskill's office to encourage her to change her pro-abortion stance. They were received in her office by her staff without much comment. Roses were

also delivered to Senator Blunt in order to reinforce his consistent pro-life advocacy and voice our support for all legislation limiting, restricting, and ending legalized abortion. The roses were also received by his staff. The teenagers who went to his office got to meet one of his aides who is originally from Ascension parish as well as speak with another aide about some recent legislation relevant to the topic of life. She explained to them the recent development with the Department of Health and Human Services to mandate all insurance plans cover contraceptives as well as abortifacients, and explained how Senator Blunt is working to expand the religious exemption to this rule.
