2017 BABY BOTTLE BRIGADE 2:

IW Knights:

Below is a copy of letter, sent on November 18, 2016 to the three Missouri State KofC parties listed below, regarding the results of the IW Knights Baby Bottle Campaign2. Additionally, Stan Mengwasser and myself were invited to a lunch to discuss the possibility of our council again acting as the manager of a Baby Bottle Brigade 2. While the total amount of donations to the IW Knights BBC2 project remain essentially the same (i.e. at the end of December 2016) we do expect to report more donations in January, 2017. It seems we have a good chance to exceed \$100,000 in total donations.

In subsequent conversations with Joe Rosenthal, the State Deputy, he asked if we would provide a plan on how a BBB2 event might operate. As a method of explaining how a Brigade2 could work, we sent him a proposed set of answers to what might be Frequently Asked Questions. If you are interested in reviewing the FAQs, they are posted at www.IWknights.com/bbb2/bbb2faqs (available after Jan7th).

As matters stand now, the exploration of the idea of another Pro-Life fund-raising joint venture between the State Council and the local councils of each diocese seems to have support but, a series of meetings will likely be necessary before we can report anything definitive to our council.

Gentlemen:

Thank you for the invitation to the lunch meeting last Monday in order to discuss the future of the Missouri Knights of Columbus Meet Life Campaign and local Respect Life efforts.

I have attached a file which contains an update to the outline we reviewed during our meeting. At the bottom of the outline is a copy of the raffle ticket (from the Pennsylvania raffle) which we referenced as a possible incentive model to be integrated into a Baby Bottle Brigade2 (BBB2) effort.

After the meeting Stan and I felt certain our council will be pleased to hear that the to-date donations from our recent Baby Bottle Campaign2 (BBC2) pushed the Meet Life Campaign over its \$2 million goal.

Additionally, subject to the approval of both our council and the State Knights, the IW BBC2 funds will be donated to the new Brigade as its initial contribution.

Concerning the Meet Life Campaign, congratulations are in order to all the State Knights who worked on this major life-enhancing project since its commencement in 2011.

Furthermore, a special nod of thanks goes to John Appelbaum for his efforts in designing and then steering the Campaign through its initial iteration.

Finally, per our discussion at the meeting, Incarnate Word Council #9981 reports **an incremental contribution to the Meet Life Campaign of \$87,545**. Moreover, we anticipate advising you in January of additional contributions. The funds collected so far have been distributed as follows:

- 1) ThriVe of St. Louis: **\$65,900.00** (all these funds were contributed directly to ThriVe under the terms of the Missouri's pro-life tax credit programs).
- 2) Coalition of Life St. Louis: **\$16,233.97** (\$5,000 were contributed directly to Coalition under the terms of the Missouri's pro-life tax credit programs).
- 3) Respect Life Apostolate - St. Louis Archdiocese: **\$5,411.29**.

Let us know if you are interested in continuing a conversation about the idea of a BBB2 with a raffle.
