Below is a letter written by our Grand Knight to Archbishop Lori, K of C Supreme Chaplin concerning support of religious freedom.

Re: Support for Religious Freedom

Your Excellency:

I wanted to begin by congratulating you on being named Archbishop of the Baltimore Archdiocese. The archdiocese and the entire Catholic community are fortunate to have you. The Knights of Columbus Council 9981 from Incarnate Word Parish in Chesterfield, MO, knowing your past addresses on the importance of standing up for our Catholic faith, wanted to write to show our support, and to request advice on what we can do as Knights of Columbus to support and defend our faith.

We are Catholics. We are Knights of Columbus. We are Americans. We are proud to be all of these. We are grateful for the gift of faith which is ours as believers in Our Lord Jesus Christ, and grateful for the gift of liberty and freedom which is ours as Americans. To be Catholic, a Knight, and an American should mean not having to choose between our religion and our government. Our allegiances to God and country should not be divergent. Our current federal government is making that more difficult with their policies.

Our Catholic faith teaches us to work together for the common good of all who live in this great nation. That is the vision of our founding fathers and our Constitution, which guarantees citizens of all religious faiths the right to contribute to our common life together. The Declaration of Independence states that *"....We hold these truths to be self-evident, that all men are created equal, that they are endowed by their **Creator** with certain unalienable Rights, that among these are Life, Liberty and the pursuit of Happiness. — That to secure these rights, Governments are instituted among Men, deriving their just powers from the consent of the governed, — **That whenever any Form of Government becomes destructive of these ends, it is the Right of the***

People to alter or to abolish it, and to institute new Government, laying its foundation on such principles and organizing its powers in such form, as to them shall seem most likely to affect their Safety and Happiness."

We have become lax as a nation and lax as Catholics in some respects. It seems we have allowed the "whatever feels good...do it" crowd to corrupt our society and insert itself into our faith. Teachings which were black and white are now being blurred by those outside our faith and even some inside our faith. We have allowed ourselves to forget the sacrifices both as a Catholic faith and as a nation that were made by our ancestors to preserve the religion and rights we have today. As a society, we also seem to skirt our responsibility that we are stewards of these gifts, not only for ourselves but for our children, grandchildren, and all nations and peoples who yearn to be free.

Because of what the federal government and particularly the Obama Administration is attempting to do to our religious freedoms, Cardinal Dolan, on behalf of the US Conference of Catholic Bishops said "This shouldn't happen in a land where free exercise of religion ranks first in the Bill of Rights".

We have been staunch defenders of religious liberty in the past. We have a solemn responsibility to discharge that duty today. We are here asking how we may be of assistance working in our Church, our community, and for the good of our faith and our nation. We look forward to any suggestions you might have so that we are working within the guidelines of the USCCB and our oath as Catholics and Knights of Columbus.
