Whereas the Trustees of the Council have determined that the net profit from the 2015 Fish Fry was \$19,863.00

And, whereas the Trustees have also determined that there are no charitable roll-over funds from the preceding fraternal year,

Now, therefore the Council has a total budget for the 2015-2016 fraternal year of \$19,863.80.

And, in accordance with the Bylaws of this Council, the above referenced funds shall be allocated as follows:

General Fund	20% X \$19,863.80	\$3,972.76
Incarnate Word Fund	20% X \$19,863.80	\$3,972.76
Council Fund	60% X \$19,863.80	\$11,918.28

Be it resolved, the sum of \$11,918.00 shall be allotted to the Charitable Fund, and contributed to charitable organizations and programs during the Fraternal Year 2015-2016 in accordance with the following charitable categories.

Church Activities (35% - exclusive of IW funds)	\$ 4,171.00
Pro-Life Activities (20%)	\$ 2,384.00
Youth Activities (10%)	\$ 1,192.00
Community Activities (35%)	\$ 4,171.00

Be it further resolved, the Fund's Administrative Committee, consisting of the Grand Knight and Trustees, shall administer the Fund in accordance with the Council's Charitable Contributions Resolution, to approve and distribute all donations.

Fish Fry Related Asset Purchases – Year 2015-2016

Whereas, the Council is considering the purchase of certain assets (see list and estimated costs below) in order to facilitate the expansion – beginning with the 2016 Lenten Fish Fry sales - outside of the Lower Church Hall and on the lower (south) parking lot in order to begin the sale of menu items to customers in a walk-up and drive-thru manner.

Whereas, the Council was able to experiment with outdoor sales during the 2015 Fish Fry the experience demonstrated that we would need certain assets to provide our customers with timely service, a comfortable order/waiting area and properly heated or chilled food. The four types of assets required, the quantity of each type and the estimated amount money needed are as follows:

- 1) **Popup tents with curtains** - 4 each, 10' x 10' in order to create reasonably comfortable preparation, service and waiting an area of 20' x 20' – estimated cost new \$200 each. (NOTE: during the first year we may be able to assemble 4 loaners from Brother Knights).
- 2) **Food Warmer on wheels** – 1 each, electric, 20 tray slots, 120v – estimated cost of \$500 used.
- 3) **Tray Rack** – 2 each, 20 slot capacity, on rollers, open sides, 200lb holding capacity with estimated cost new \$200 each (NOTE – these items will be used for fish thawing in addition to storage and delivery to outdoor service area.
- 4) **Propane Heater** – 1 each (at least to begin with but perhaps 2 more) – 6'+ height for exterior use, \$300.00 new.

The parish has installed the necessary electrical outlets so we have ample to power to operate those assets which require electricity.

Be it resolved, the sum of \$1,200.00 reserved for the purchase equipment described above (excluding for the tents for the time being).
