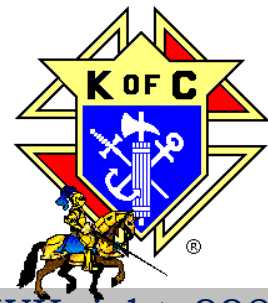

A new program model titled "**Faith in Action**" will take effect this year. The new program replaces **Surge with Service** which was introduced 50 years ago. The new model is an evolution of the Building the Domestic Church initiative that was introduced in 2015. This month I challenge you to become even more like Jesus, the "servant of all," by making an act of charity or someone in your life from whom you have been distant, or whom you have wronged. Secondly, I challenge you to prayerfully reflect on these words from Scripture: "Beloved, if God so loved us, we also must love one another" (1Jn. 4:11)
